

Dear visitors,

You should keep your personal ID or passport and a address in germany on it with you in order to register if required. Persons under 16 years of age need to have signed their application form by a legal guardian. Moreover, they need one of their legal guardian's personal documents to register.

What does a library card cost?

Adults pay 16 Euros for an annual card and 10 Euros for six months (50 percent off for Leipzig-Pass holders). Children under 6 do not receive a library card.

Children up to 6 and persons to the age of 19 can use the library for free.

To use our special stock in the reading room, you can buy a day ticket for 5 Euros.

Attention!

The library card can be used by the holder only. You are required to produce it when you want to borrow books.

The library card allows you to take books and other media home. Moreover, you can use the internet connection and the reading rooms. The same holds for our branch libraries.

When do you have to return the books?

Books, teaching material, music supplies, games: after 4 weeks

Magazines, DVDs, videos, CDs, cassettes, CD-ROMs: after one (!) week

You can extend this period twice, by phone (0341-123 53 43) or via the internet (www.leipzig.de/stadtbib). In case you want to extend for a third time you have to appear at the library and show the borrowed media. You cannot extend if another person has ordered it.

What will I have to pay, if I do not return or extend in time?

Adults 0,30 Euros per medium and day

Children and adolescents 0,15 Euros per medium and day

You have lost your library card?

A new library card costs 5 Euros for adults and 2,50 Euros for children and adolescents.

You want to order a book which is borrowed at the moment?

This will cost you 0,80 Euros plus postage.

What does the internet cost?

Using our internet connection costs 1 Euro for each started hour.

What does copying cost?

One page costs 0,10 Euros.

You have lost a medium or damaged it?

In this case you will have to buy a new sample in consultation with the library and pay an extra 6 Euros.
